

American Committee on Clinical Tropical Medicine and Travelers' Health – Clinical Group (ACCTMTH) ACCTMTH Clinical Research Award

The ACCTMTH Clinical Research Award recognizes excellence in clinically-oriented research presented by a student (within six months of completing undergraduate or master's level training, including medical undergraduate degrees) or person in graduate medical training at the Annual Meeting.

Clinical research is a component of medical and health research intended to produce knowledge valuable for understanding human disease, preventing and treating illness, and promoting health. Clinical Research embraces a continuum of studies involving interactions with patients, diagnostic clinical materials or data, or populations in any of the following categories: (1) disease mechanisms (etiopathogenesis); (2) bi-directional integrative (translational) research; (3) clinical knowledge, detection, diagnosis and natural history of disease; (4) therapeutic interventions including development and clinical trials of drugs, biologics, devices, and instruments; (5) prevention (primary and secondary) and health promotion; (6) behavioral research; (7) health services research, including outcomes, and cost-effectiveness; (8) epidemiology; and (9) community-based and managed care-based trials. If your research does not meet the definition of clinical research it may not be considered for the award.

All participants will receive a \$200 cash award/Visa card to be used toward Annual Meeting expenses. You must participate in the session on Wednesday, November 13, 2024 in person in order to receive the funds. In addition, first, second and third place winners will receive cash awards/Visa cards in the amounts of \$750 US, \$500 US and \$300 US, respectively. Winners will be announced during the Awards Program on November 13, 2024 and will receive acknowledgement formally during the Clinical Group Business Meeting. Winners will be invited to attend the President's Reception held during the Annual Meeting.

Application Instructions

Part 1: Abstract Submission Site

In order to be considered for the ACCTMTH Clinical Research Award, applicant must submit and pay for their abstract on the Annual Meeting ABSTRACT submission site by April 17.

By April 17, submit and pay for the abstract on the Annual Meeting ABSTRACT submission site.

The Annual Meeting ABSTRACT submission site will assign an abstract number. The abstract number format is 24-A-1234-ASTMH. Applicants will need this abstract number for Part 2 of the ACCTMTH Clinical Research Award submission.

Part 2: ACCTMTH Clinical Research Award Submission Site

The award application submission site opens on March 20. By April 17, submit the award application <u>here</u>. Only one application per applicant can be submitted.

Upload a letter (on institutional letterhead) from a faculty supervisor or advisor attesting to and describing the role of the trainee in the study.

Note about username and password: The username and password for the Annual Meeting ABSTRACT submission site and the ACCTMTH Clinical Research Award application submission site ARE NOT THE SAME. Applicants will have a different username and password for each site.

Required Materials

- A cover letter from the applicant describing his/her career interest in clinical tropical medicine. (3,000 character limit).
- The Annual Meeting abstract to be considered for the ACCTMTH Clinical Research Award, including abstract number assigned by submission site.
- Applicants must submit a letter (on institutional letterhead) from a faculty supervisor or advisor attesting to and describing the role of the trainee in the study. These letters must be uploaded by applicant in pdf or Word format.
- 2x2 high resolution headshot photo to be used on signage at the Annual Meeting.

Eligibility Criteria

- The applicants must be available to present his/her work during the ACCTMTH Clinical Research Award competition in New Orleans, LA.
- The applicant must have had a primary role in the reported experimentation, as evidenced by firstauthor status on the abstract.
- Previous Clinical Research Award winners can apply again, but research MUST be new and not previously presented.
