APPLICATION DEADLINE: APRIL 21, 2021

ASTMH Presidents' Challenge, BMGF Travel Awards support the travel of selected students, young investigators and scientists actively working in the tropical medicine field to attend and participate in the Annual Meeting. Awardees are selected through a competitive process. Those selected participate in the meeting through oral or poster presentations. Selections are based on abstract quality, research results and career development potential. ASTMH membership is not required. Residents of Low and Low-Middle Income Countries (LMIC) are particularly encouraged to apply.

AWARD: Awardees receive a stipend to offset the cost to participate in the Annual Meeting in National Harbor, Maryland, round-trip coach airfare and complimentary registration.

ASTMH YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARDS

APPLICATION DEADLINE: APRIL 21, 2021

Each year, ASTMH recognizes the work of outstanding young investigators through the presentation of the Young Investigator Award, a yearly competition held during the first day of the Annual Meeting. This award encourages young scientists to pursue careers in various aspects of tropical disease research.

AWARD: Winners receive \$900 US cash award, First-tier Mentions receive \$600 US cash award and Honorable Mentions receive \$450 US cash award.




