Clinical Pre-Meeting Course:

**Tropical Diseases Encountered in Non-Travel Clinics**

Wednesday, November 20, 7 am – 4:15 pm

This full day course will cover a broad range of tropical diseases which are commonly encountered in the primary care setting. The course is designed for clinicians who are already familiar with clinical tropical and travel medicine. We will focus on problems in tropical and travel medicine that are commonly seen by a primary care provider caring for either migrants, ill travelers, or travelers at risk for infectious exposures. The overall objective will be to help practitioners update their knowledge base in these areas, and improve their comfort level in managing these types of problems. There will be relatively little discussion of topics which are typically managed by specialty referral centers. The speakers will emphasize new or controversial aspects of diagnosis and management. The target audience includes any clinician who wants to develop a deeper understanding of tropical and travel medicine.
