 YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARD — GRADUATE (Masters or Doctoral career level in 2017)

This award is presented to a graduate student who presents research either orally or in a poster format during the meeting. The subject matter must involve research that includes arthropods of medical importance.

AWARD: Complimentary registration and up to \$900 USD cash award

### YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARD — POST-DOCTORAL (Graduation to have occurred 2015-2017)

This award is presented to a post-doc who presents research either orally or in a poster format during the meeting. The subject matter must involve research that includes arthropods of medical importance.

AWARD: Complimentary registration and up to \$900 USD cash award

### YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARD — INTERNATIONAL

#### (Country of primary institution must be non-U.S.)
