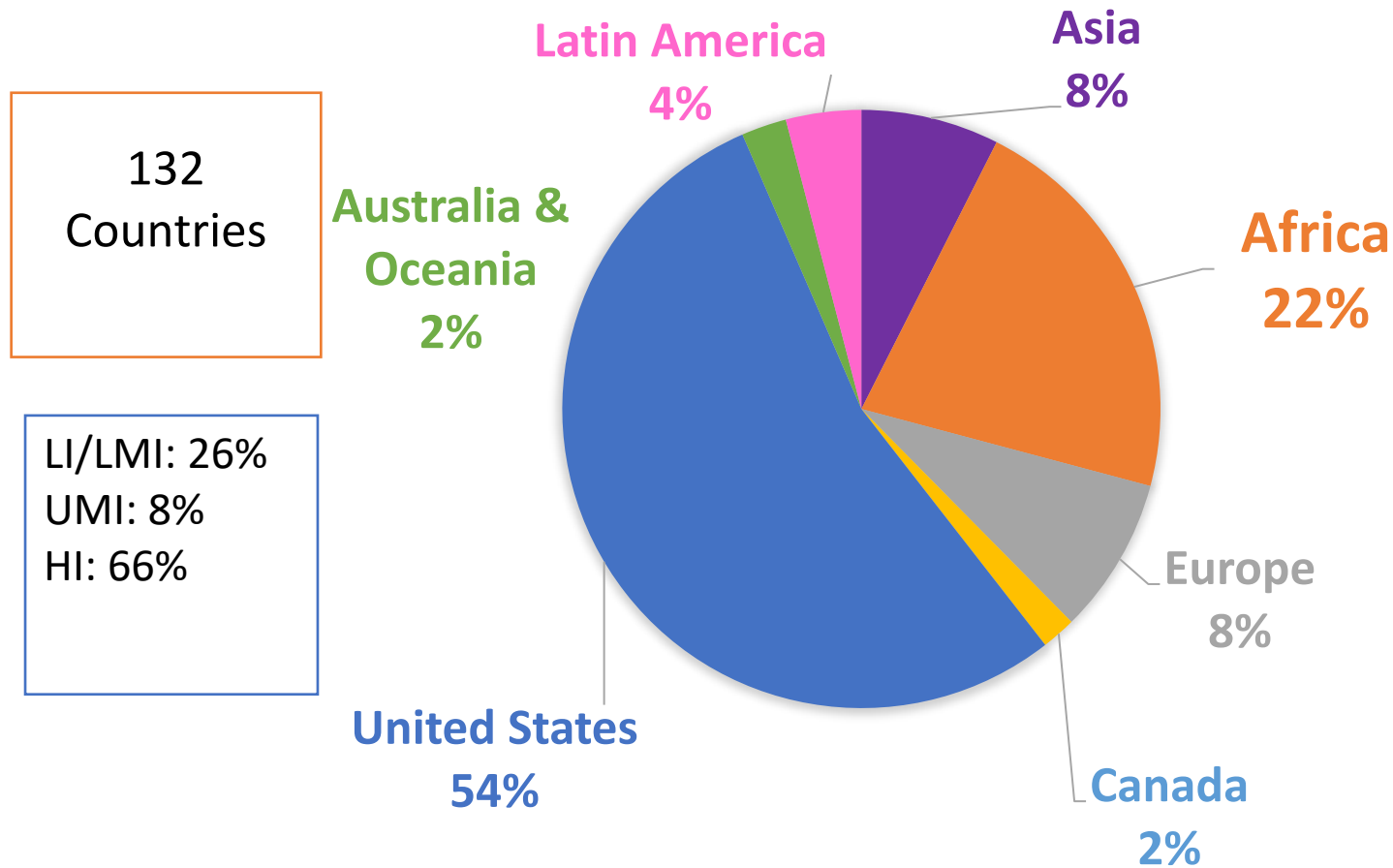

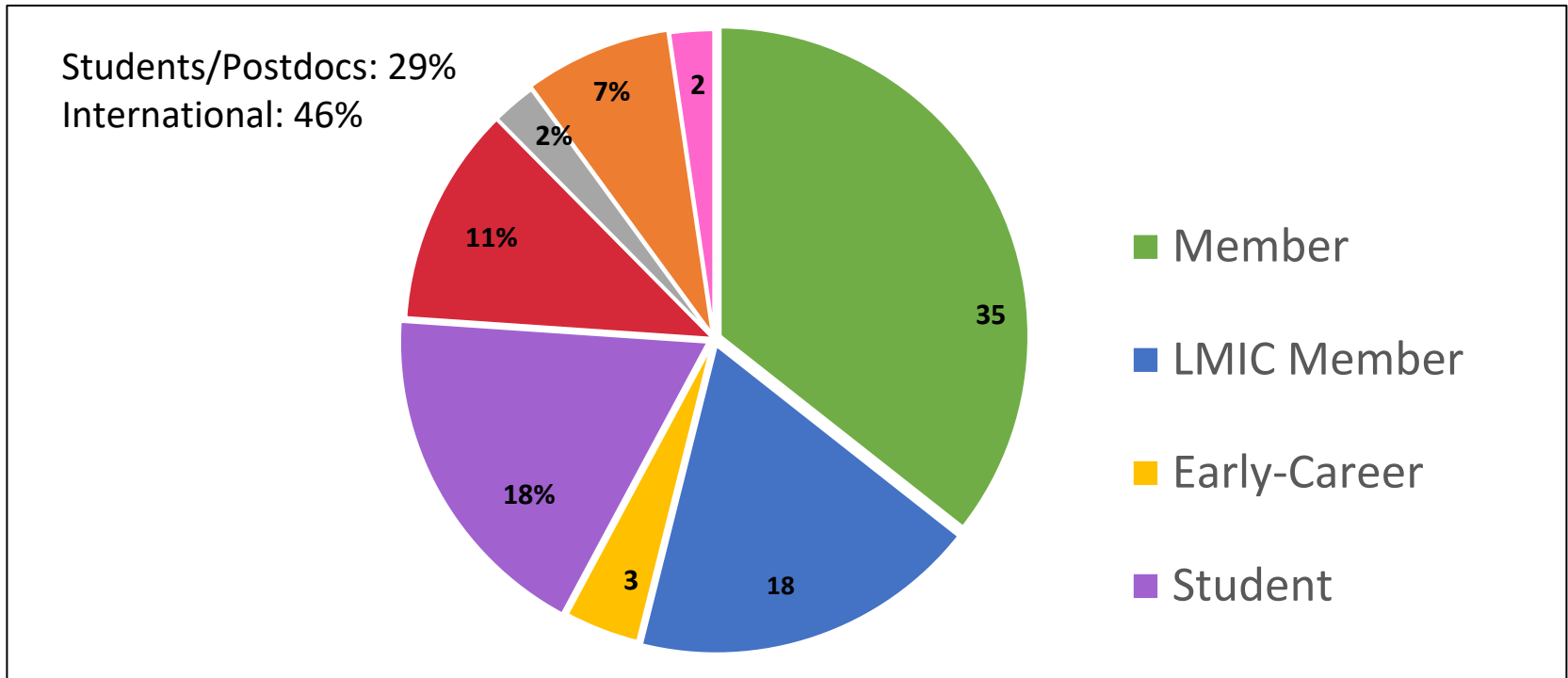
2022 Annual Meeting Attendees

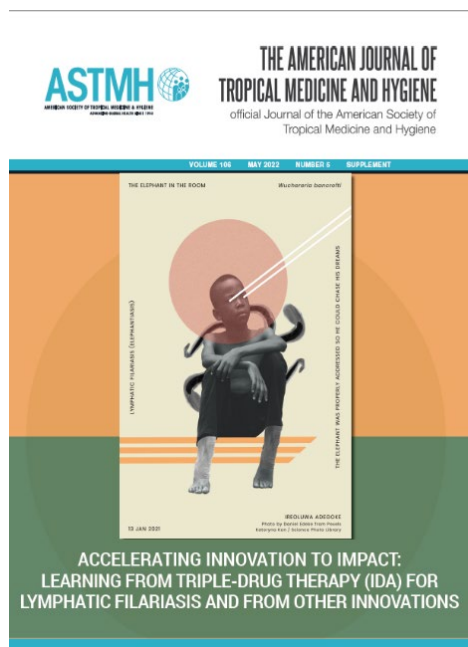


New LMIC Members Response on Twitter

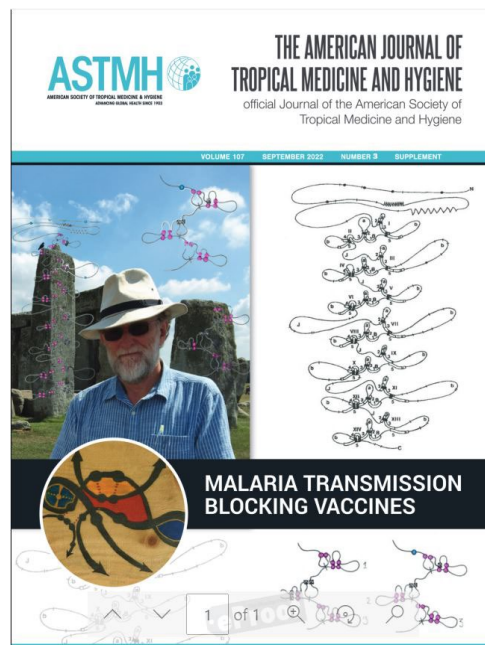

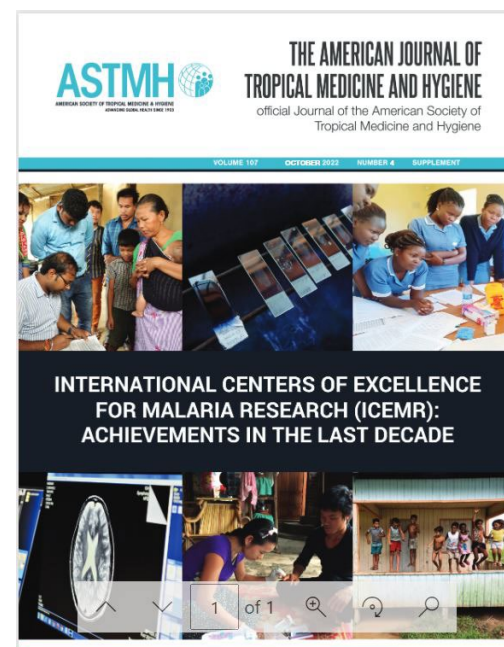

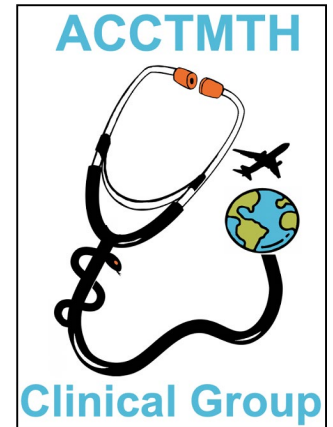
Responding to Member Concerns

Problem: Unacceptable pause in all diagnostic testing operations for parasitic diseases

Response: Spring and continuing

-

ASTMH and Clinical Group engage directly with CDC



- ASTMH in touch with CDC's Division of Parasitic Diseases and Malaria in the Center for Global Health highlighting the need for timely and full restoration of diagnostic testing of parasitic diseases

-Joint call with ASTMH, Clinical Group members, CDC

-Concerned Clinical Group members publish in AJTMH

-ASTMH letter to Dr Walensky urging swift action

-Dr Jay Butler, CDC Deputy Director for Infectious Diseases sends personal response

-CDC response in AJTMH – “High Quality Parasitic Disease Lab Services a Priority”

-Collaboration leads to rolling updates on the resumption of available tests

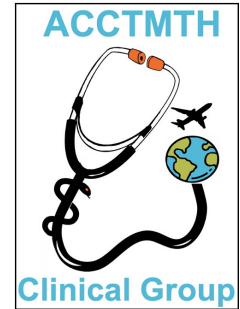


Responding to Members Concerns

Problem: Physicians' Ability to Access Glucantime for the Treatment of Leishmaniasis Unclear

Response:

- March through August - ASTMH and members from Clinical Group, CDC, USUHS, and Sanofi connect to find a resolution
- Several calls and a LOT of emails
- Result: Step-by-step process identified for physicians to acquire Glucantime through Sanofi
- One of the members involved suggested this as be an update to a Leish treatment chapter she is involved with.

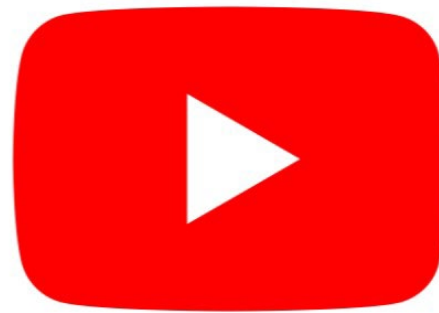

- FAST Package: a coalition of organizations and health professionals working to educate the public and encourage health professionals to include FGS screening during routine visits.
- "FGS is low-hanging fruit when it comes to addressing disparities in women's health," Dr. Jacobson wrote. "The biggest barrier is a lack of awareness of the problem."



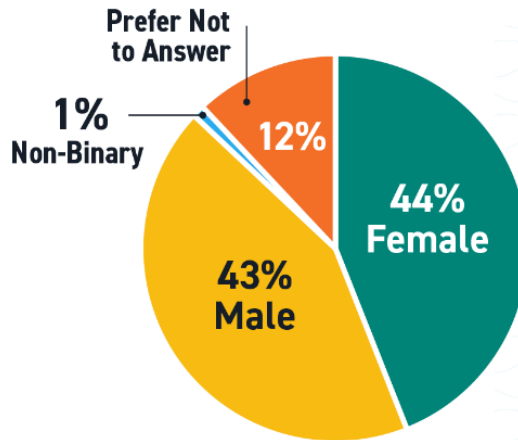

2022 Annual Meeting Attendees



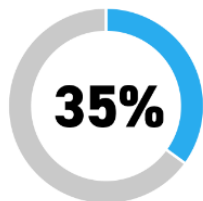
