In commemoration of Alan Magill and his dream of a world free of malaria, the ASTMH hosted the 2024 Alan Magill Malaria Policy Forum on World Malaria Day. The theme of the event was "The Global and Local: Why is Malaria on the Move and to What Extent Is Climate Change a Factor?" The Forum began with panel discussions on the regional trends of malaria migration, hosted by ASTMH President Linnie Golightly MD, and including Daniel Jernigan MD, MPH (CDC), Miriam Laufer MD, FASTMH (University of Maryland, School of Medicine), and Roberto Montoya MD (PAHO).

The second panel discussion about the impact of climate change on the fight against malaria was hosted by Jamie Bay Nishi, CEO of ASTMH, and featured Drs. Winter Okoth (ASTMH) and Meera Venkatesan (PMI). Dr. Venkatesan discussed how PMI is adjusting by selecting the right interventions based on weather data and surveillance systems, and Dr. Okoth discussed the amazing role that scientists and medical professionals play as human rights advocates. Mission

Global Health News: The Seventy-seventh World Health Assembly was held in Geneva, Switzerland, from the 27 May – 1 June 2024. The theme of this year's Assembly was: All for Health, Health for All.

Although the ASTMH wasn't directly present at WHA 77, we were represented under the <u>Global Health Council</u> umbrella which engaged in extensive advocacy efforts at the event. Their focus was on a number of key issues including Universal Health Coverage, Antimicrobial Resistance, Pandemic Preparedness, Climate Change, and Non-State Actor Engagement.

Advocacy In Action

In today's world almost everything has been affected by climate change and the field of Tropical Medicine is no different. Globally, mosquito seasons are now longer, extending well past the summer and therefore, affecting the patterns of diseases like dengue, chikungunya, and Zika. In addition, researchers are predicting that climate change will soon expand the global reach of disease-causing mosquitoes beyond the tropics. This would greatly shift the global disease burden and put a greater proportion of the world's population at risk for these infectious diseases. Therefore, it is paramount that we act now in order to save the planet and protect future generations from the devastating effects of these diseases.
