## **ACGH Executive Committee Spotlight**

**Andrea G. Buchwald, PhD** is a Research Associate at the University of Maryland School of Medicine. She completed her PhD in Epidemiology at the University of Maryland Baltimore and went on to do a Post-Doctoral Fellowship at the University of Colorado School of Public Health focusing on environmental epidemiology. Dr. Buchwald spent 2020 through 2021 working directly with local and state-level government and public health entities to evaluate and control the COVID-19 pandemic in Colorado. Dr. Buchwald's current research interests include long-term outcomes among infants exposed to infectious diseases in utero, maternal vaccination, malaria transmission, the impacts of climate change on vector-borne diseases, and improving the utility of mathematical transmission modeling. She has been a member of ASTMH since 2015 and has been involved in public health work ranging from research in HIV vaccine development, malaria epidemiology, and clinical trials of maternal vaccines.





**Alexander Kwarteng, MPhil, PhD,** is a Senior Lecturer at the Department of Biochemistry and Biotechnology at Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST), Ghana and a Senior Research Fellow at Kumasi Center for Collaborative Research in Tropical Medicine (KCCR). Dr. Kwarteng serves in numerous academic, research and professional leadership roles, both locally and internationally. He is currently the President of the Ghana Science Association, Kumasi. He is one of the Board of Directors of The Microbiome Vault, Inc., USA, as well as holds a member status with the American Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene (ASTMH). Dr. Kwarteng forms part of the Young Investigator Award Committee of the ASTMH.

Katherine Wolf, Jadmin Mostel, Lolade Oseni et al. *Use of Supervision Data to Improve Quality of Care for Malaria in Pregnancy: Experience in Six African Countries.* The American Journal of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene. 2023 Dec 26.

Malaria in pregnancy intervention coverage, especially intermittent preventive treatment in pregnancy (IPTp), lags behind other global malaria indicators. In 2020, across Africa, only 32% of eligible pregnant women received at least three IPTp doses, despite high antenatal care attendance. We conducted a secondary analysis of data collected during outreach, training, and supportive supervision visits from 2019 to 2020 to assess quality of care and explore factors contributing to providers' competence in providing IPTp, insecticide-treated nets, malaria case management, and respectful maternity care.
