

ACMCIP's Junior Investigator Award in Parasitology Research

Purpose

The Junior Investigator Award, introduced in 2022, recognizes a junior scientist who has made significant contributions in the field of cellular molecular and immunoparasitology.

Eligibility

The award is open to any junior investigators (Lecturer, Instructor, Research Scientist, Assistant Professor) who are within five years of starting their independent program. The award recognizes individuals who have made important contributions in basic parasitology. These contributions must have been made after the receipt of their terminal degree. Nominees cannot be more than five years removed from their first faculty appointment at the time of the ASTMH meeting. The findings must have been published, no more than five years before the date of the nomination.

Funding and Announcement

This annual award carries a stipend of \$1,000 US and a complimentary registration to attend the 2022 Annual Meeting. The awardee can use the funds for any purpose, including travel to the ASTMH Annual Meeting. The recipient will be recognized during the ACMCIP Council Meeting and ACMCIP's Business Meeting, following the ACMCIP Trager and Trainee symposium during the ASTMH Annual Meeting.

Application requirements

- ASTMH members and non-members may submit nominations; the nominee does not need to be an ASTMH member. Self-nominations will not be accepted.
- Nominations of individuals underrepresented in science are strongly encouraged
- Nominations must include:
 - Brief CV (four page maximum)
 - Letter of nomination that clearly states the timing and significance of the scientific contribution and succinctly explains why the nominee is a suitable recipient
 - Hi-resolution recent photo
- Application deadline: September 12, 2022

Determination

Nominations will be reviewed by a selection panel, chaired by the ACMCIP President-Elect and at least two other senior researchers with expertise within the ACMCIP remit. The selection panel will be balanced regarding gender and ethnicity reflective of ACMCIP membership. The panel is empowered to add a member(s) if specific scientific expertise is required. If no suitable applicant is identified in a given year, no award will be made.
