Brief course description	This course is designed to provide training in tropical medicine and global public health issues through a multidisciplinary approach to disease. Traveler's health is covered in detail as well. The course is divided into four modules: Module 1 - Introduction to Global Public Health; Module 2 - Clinical Practice in the Tropics and Traveler's Health; Module 3 - Medical Parasitology and Simulations; and Module 4 - Infectious Diseases. Modules 1, 2, 3, and 4 are offered online, with an in-person lab component (July 8 - 26, 2024). Participants who take Modules 1, 2, 3, and 4 will have two years to complete the coursework. Participants may take one or more modules in a given year and in any order. Lectures, laboratory components and detailed case studies will examine specific tropical diseases and stress diagnosis, treatment, and implementation of preventive and control measures. In addition to Parasitology, Module 3 also contains simulations in Ultrasound, Neonatal Resuscitation, and Peds Procedural Pearls. All elements of ASTMH curriculum are covered, as well as practical aspects of providing quality health care in resource-limited settings.
